# 2015 New Mexico Black Expo: Impact Report

# **PURPOSE**

The New Mexico Black Expo (NMBE) celebrates the history and legacy of the Black cultural experience, while providing resources in the areas of economics, education, healthcare and advocacy to improve the quality of life in the African American community.

### **HISTORY**

Operated by the New Mexico Office of African American Affairs, the NMBE has served the Albuquerque community since 2003. The expo has grown to become the largest African-American tradeshow in the state and **now draws 4,000+ attendees, 175+ exhibitors, 110+ volunteers**, and numerous attractions over the course of the three-day empowerment weekend.

Over the past three years the expo has grown 100%+ each year, adding new features to include the cosmetology industry (hair battle), Black business owners and professionals, healthcare industry, African Immigrant Village, statewide performing artists, and national entertainment; such as the legendary Howard Hewett, lead actor on the hit television show "Hangin with Mr. Cooper" Mark Curry, award winning gospel artists Kim Burrell, Da'T.R.U.T.H., Earnest Pugh, award winning film maker Coy Poitier, international empowerment speaker and film maker Cleveland Robertson, Sir Earl Toon, Kool and the Gang Charter Member .

# **ATTENDANCE**

Participants traveled from **13 New Mexico cities** (Farmington, Santa Fe, Las Cruces, Corrales, Roswell, Clovis, Hobbs, Los Lunas, Rio Rancho, Bernalillo, Jemez Springs, Vequita and Albuquerque), as well as **Texas and Mississippi** to attend and participate as volunteers, exhibitors, and entertainers.

# **ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT**

**Career Fair** - Under partnership with New Mexico Workforce Connections, **43 employers and 3 resource exhibitors** were present to offer available positions and recruit minority leadership talent from the 325+ attendees.

**Workshops and Luncheon** - Workshop and economic empowerment sessions were facilitated by leading professionals in their field. **Over 200 participants** attended workshop sessions and the Ed Corley Sr. Corporate luncheon where participants witnessed the signing of a Strategic Alliance between the US Small Business Administration and the NM Office of African American Affairs. **20+ statewide Black owned businesses and chamber of commerce presidents were present.** 

# **HEALTH AWARENESS**

Understanding that African Americans are at the forefront of America's health crisis, the health fair is a collaboration of **30** agencies offered over **125** free health screenings and education information (vision, flu shots, blood pressure, diabetes checks), demonstrations and healthy living information designed to help individuals to live healthy lives. On-site consultations were conducted with the **39** participants who showed abnormal diabetes and blood pressure testing.

# **EXHIBITORS AND SMALL BUSINESS**

For the first time in NMBE history, the venue attracted **178 exhibitors** consisting of health, economic, community organizations, educational, children programing, and small business owners. **28 retail exhibitors gained a total combined revenue of \$12,375.**
